Fonthill House Open Garden Success!



The sun shone for us all when Lord Margadale generously opened Fonthill House gardens gates to the public, in aid of our school on Sunday 7th May.

The Dubinskas family helped set everything up and led the beauty stall whilst also selling a great number of second hand books that were given to the school recently. Alexa and Faith Mackenzie, Kate Bender and Flora ran the Arts & Crafts stall, helping children with various activities, such as pencil case painting and rock decorating. Kate Brooks, Bev and Emma ran the raffle, raising an amazing £257. The jars of honey with the children's designs sold out within a couple of hours raising another £72. Sarah, Louise, Claire, Tanya and the children all helped run skittles, lucky dip and lolly games, which proved very popular and sold out completely before the afternoon ended! The Kirk family also worked tirelessly to ensure all visitors were supplied with delicious cakes and teas during the entire afternoon. Mr Smith, joined by his family for the day, helped the day run smoothly and brought everything together seamlessly.

The school choir, led by Mr Sutcliffe, performed during the afternoon and sang five well-rehearsed songs beautifully, watched by a large crowd of visitors – for many visitors they remarked this was considered the highlight of the day. An unexpected £70 was also raised by Harry and Ollie busking on the choir piano, when Lord Margadale put out a top hat to collect donations!

Messums gallery in Tisbury had a classic white Jaguar on display in the car park drawing in the crowds and kindly donated £70 from selling programmes to their event. All the visitors arriving by car were also expertly directed at the event by parents Richard W, Chris F and Matthew R – thank you to all their help as well! The Beckford Bottle Shop also gave 25% of their proceeds to the school, which also raised over £100. We are incredibly thankful to these local businesses for giving so generously to our school as well as donating raffle prizes too.

Together with the cost of admission and proceeds from the tea tent and a further donation from the National Garden Trust who also visited the gardens on Monday, **the grand total raised was a staggering £5264.21.**

None of this would have been possible without all the support and help from the local community, parents and children and thank all those who were involved and came along to support the event. This incredible sum of money will give us a wonderful start to revamping our kitchen and enabling fresh food to be cooked at the school once again, together with the possibility of funding other exciting projects to benefit the children, which otherwise wouldn't be possible.

Bullying

I have needed to speak with several pupils recently about unkind behaviour at play and lunchtime. We recently had a visit from the NSPCC who delivered the excellent message 'speak out', this is good advice and we want parents to join us in reminding pupils that they must tell us if they are aware of problems. When issues that arise normally between pupils are not reported they go unchecked, this over time is bullying. We do not want to have anyone in our school who feels bullied.

The recent problems have been made worse because children have not been talking to adults and their friends have not been asking adults for help. Children should not try and fix problems like this by themselves, this often makes things worse.

In Chilmark School we have a clear solution to this problem, one that we must all repeat to the pupils as often as possible, **speak out** and **do not stop asking for help until it stops!**
